LEARN-TO-SWIM PROGRAM - TERM 4 SWIMMING LESSONS 2016

We are now taking enrolments for our Preschool and School-age 'Learn-To-Swim' program during Term 4, 2016. Lessons run by Yamba Swim Academy consist of one or two 30-minute lessons a week, for a period of 8 weeks in Term 4, and again over 8 weeks in Term 1. Please note that these lessons are completely separate to the Swimming Program that Schools hold in Term 4 of each year.

First night in the pool for this season is 14th October.

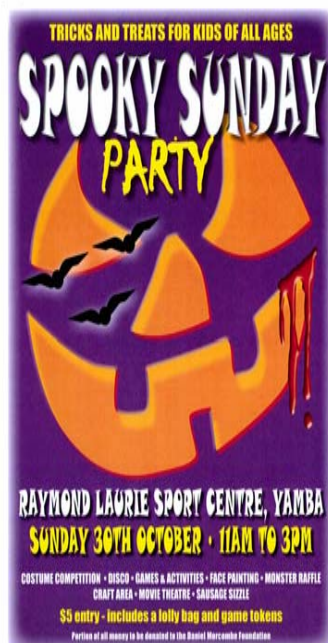

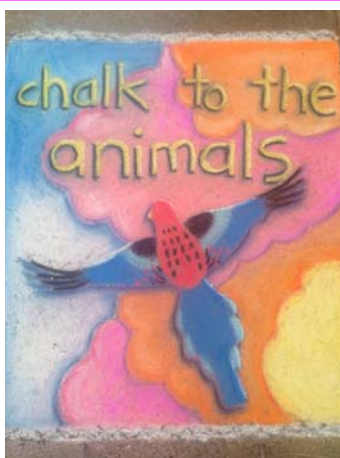

All you need to do is do some chalk art on the pavement no bigger than 1 square meter.

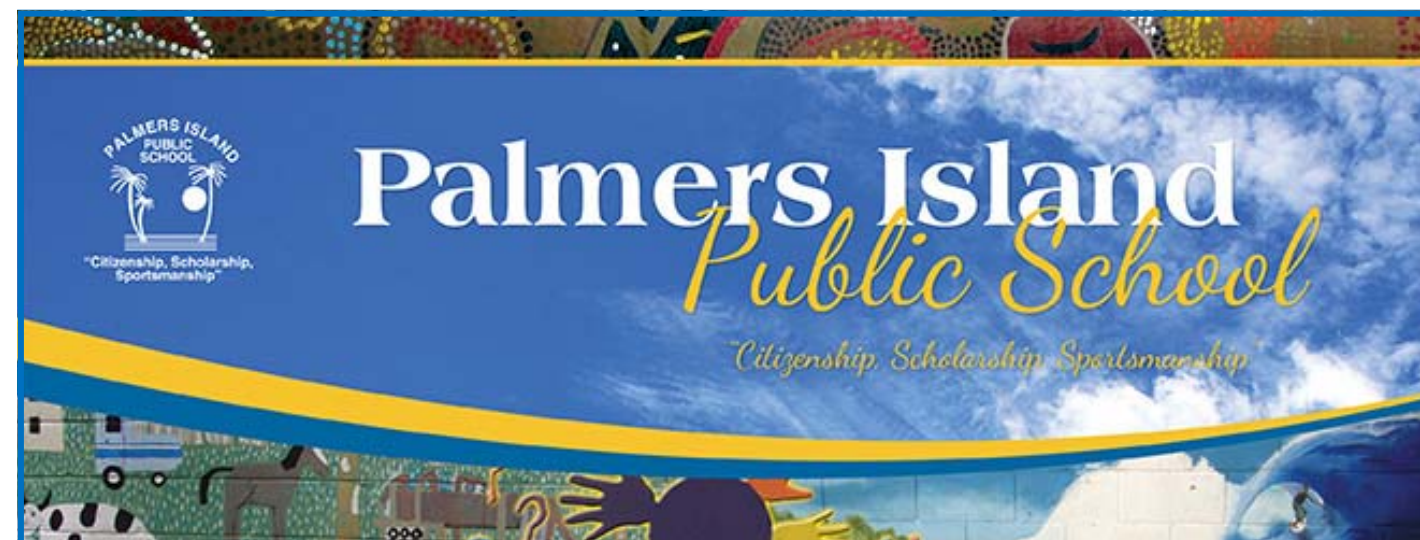
It will cost \$2 to enter and all proceeds go to Happy Paws Haven Animal Refuge.
